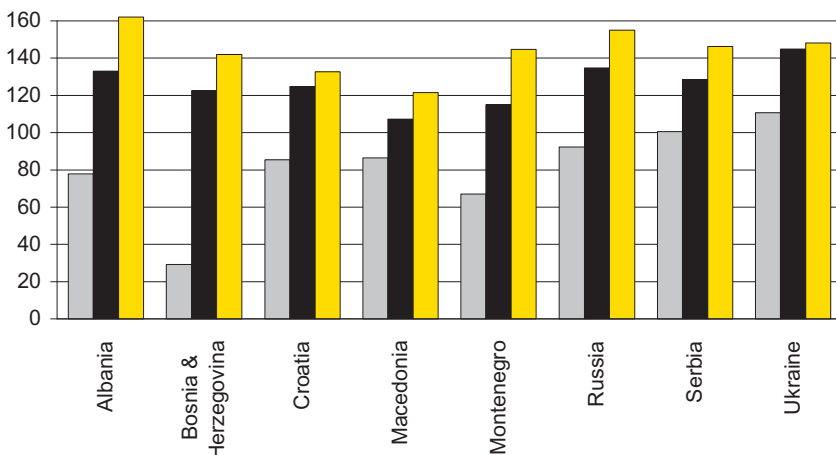

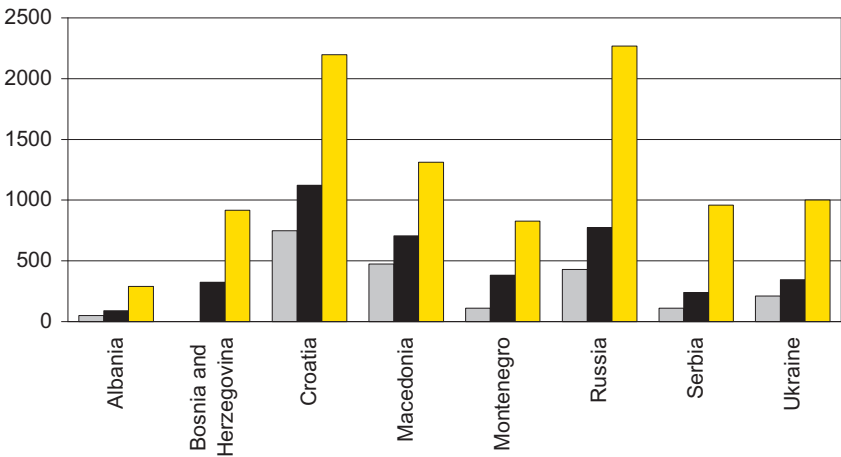
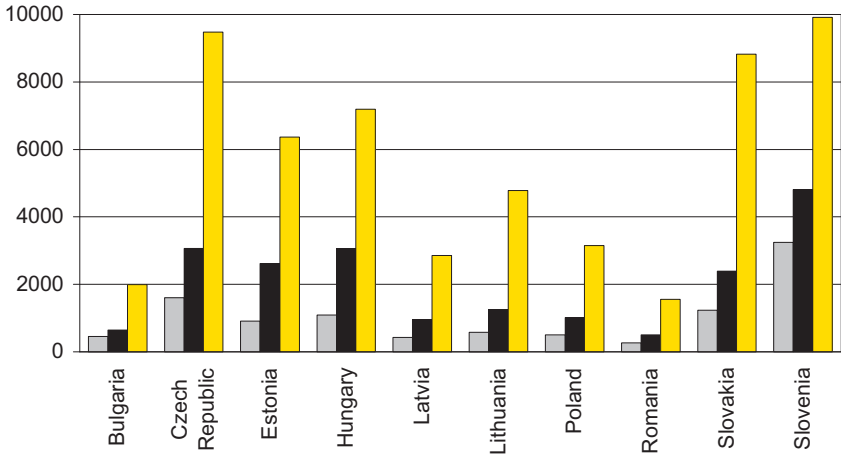
Exports of goods per capita (BOP)

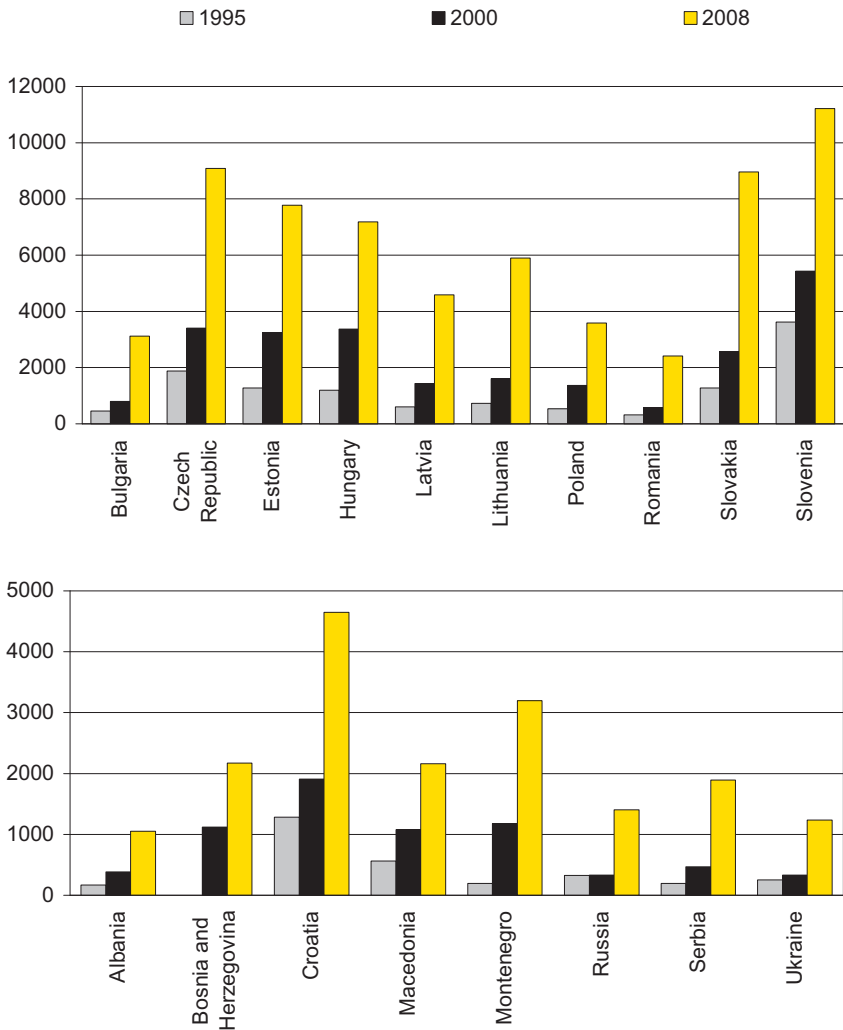

EUR

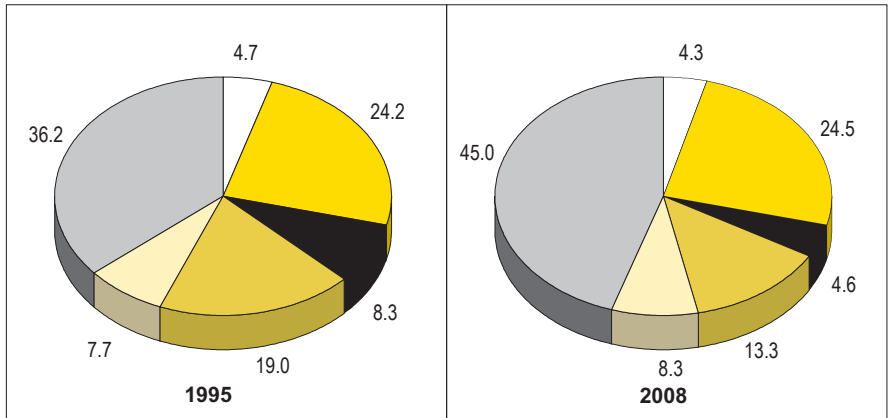

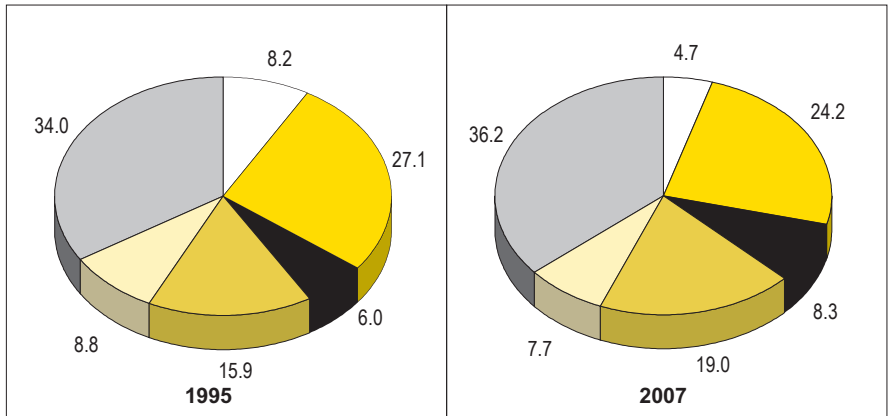

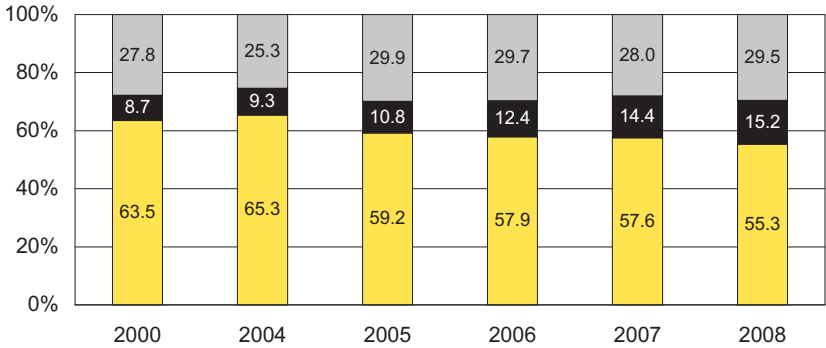

Romania: Foreign trade by country groupings

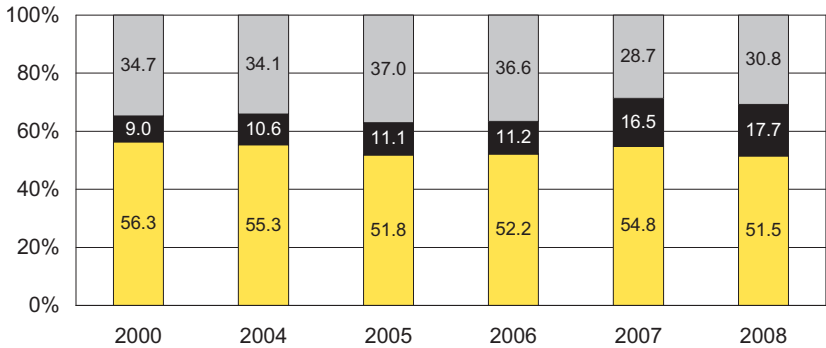

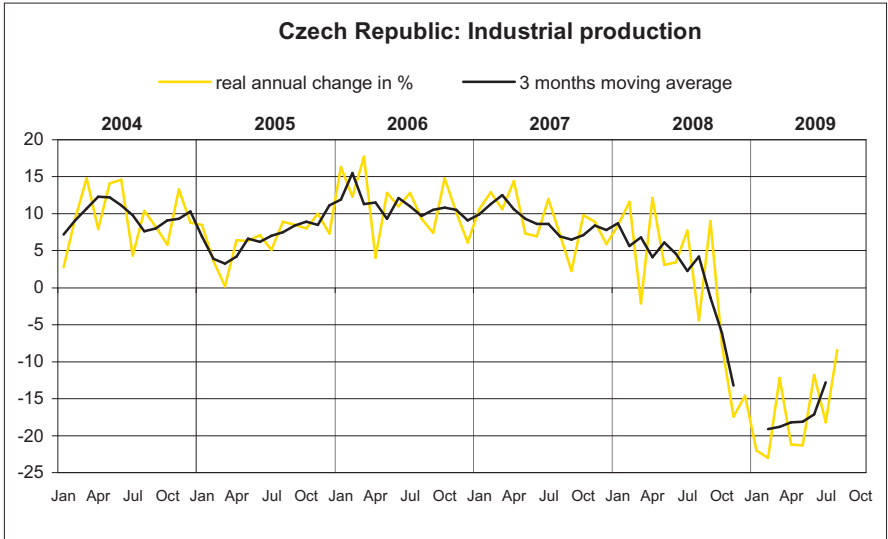

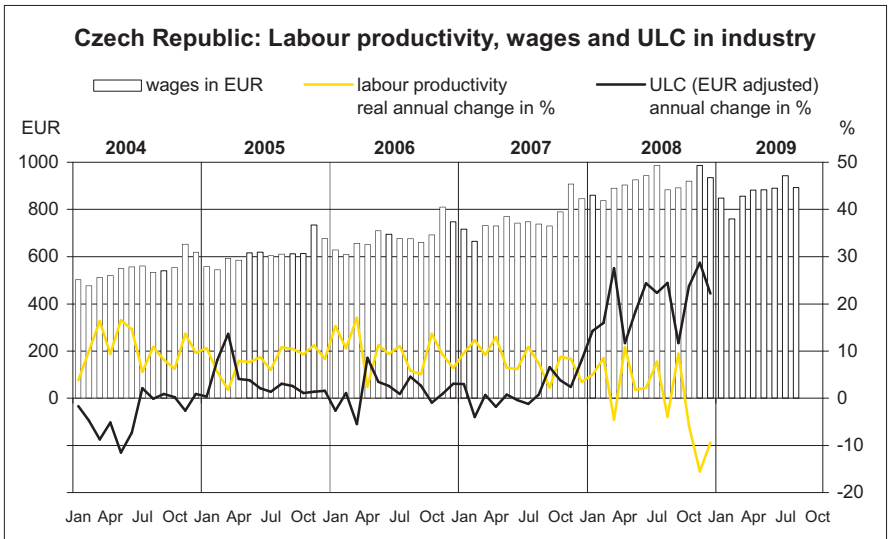

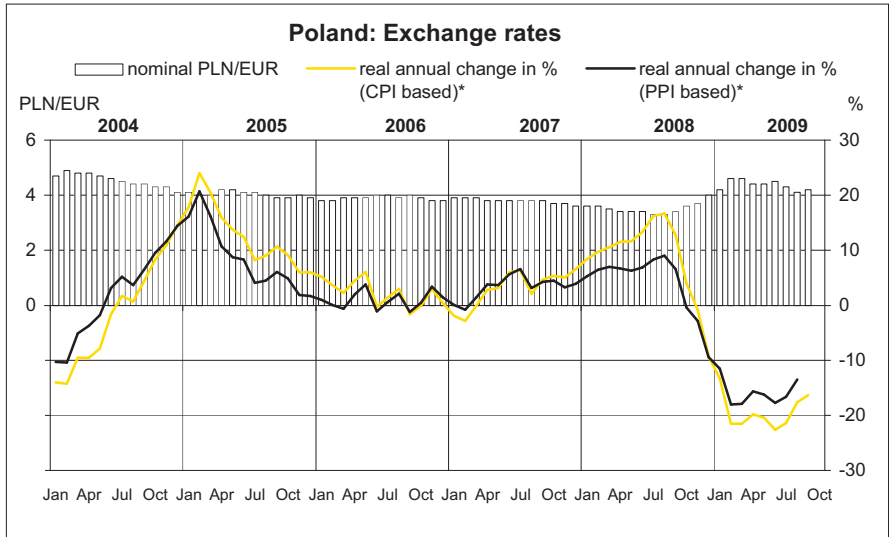
