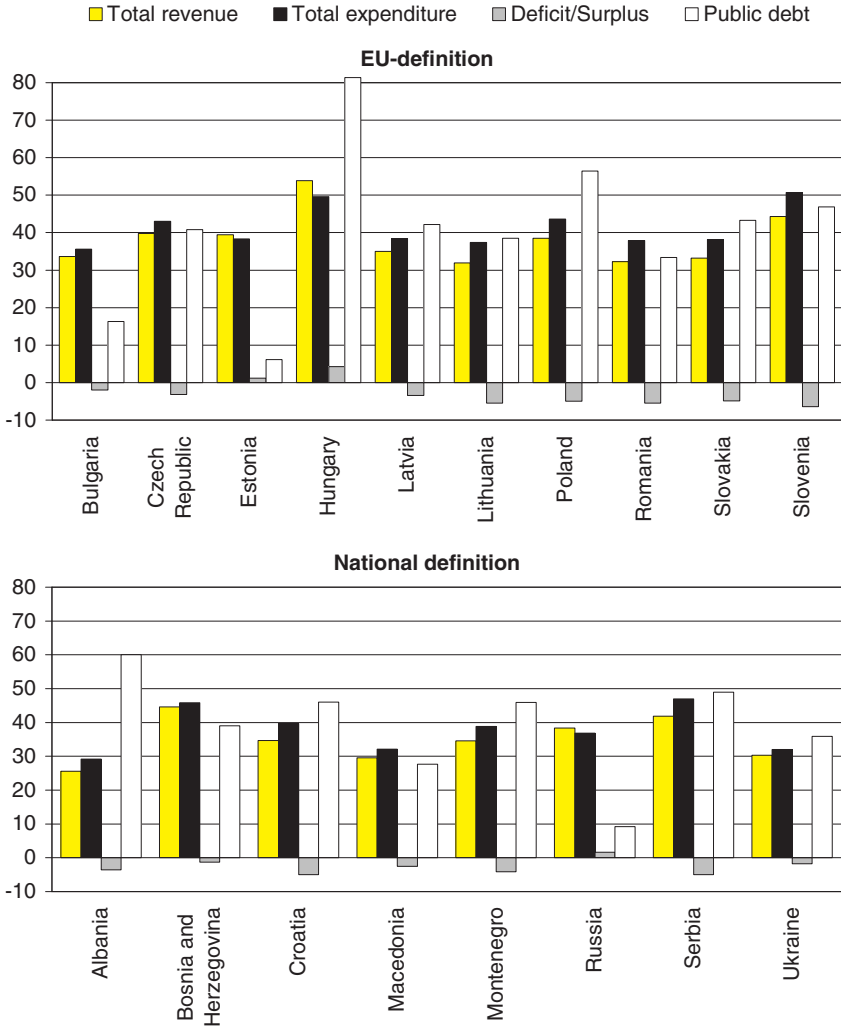

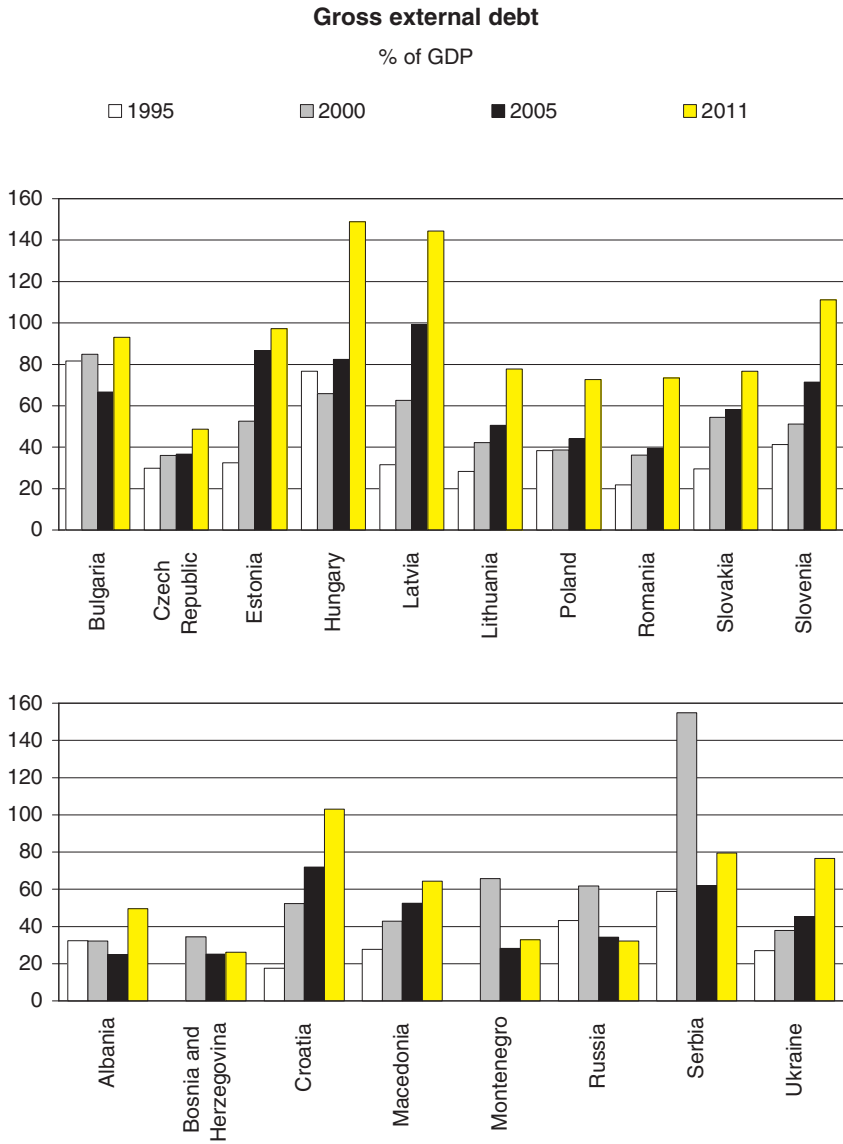
General government budget and public debt, 2011

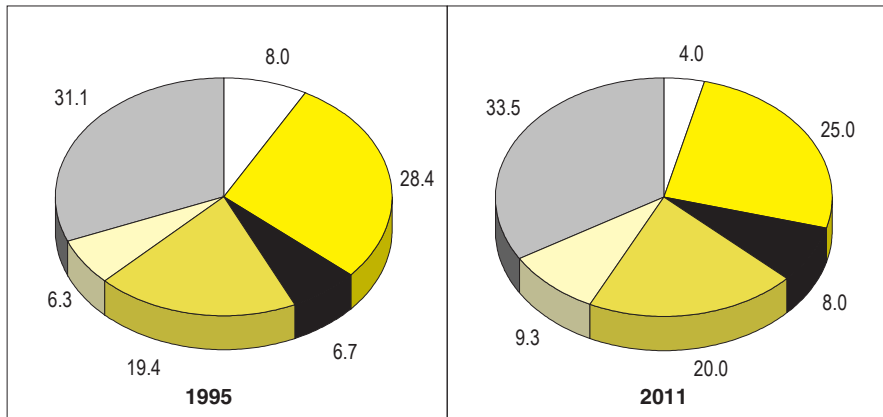

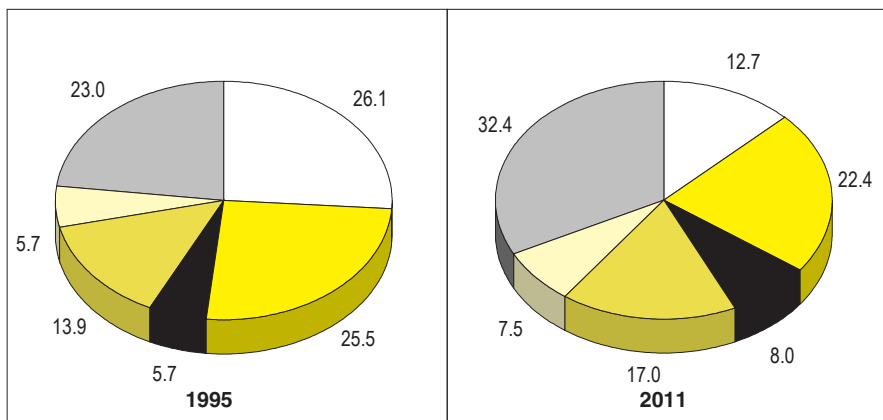

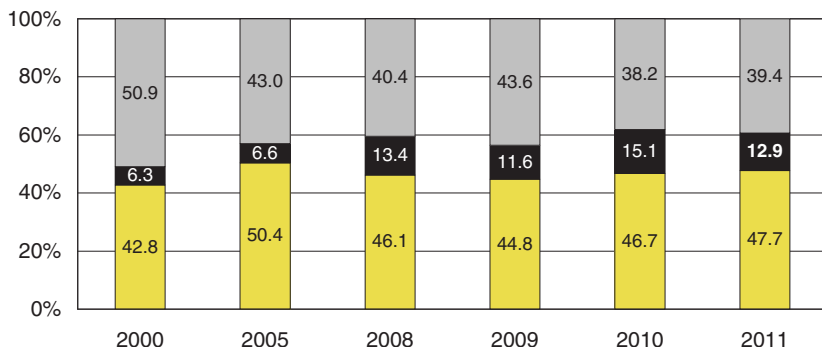

Macedonia: Foreign trade by country groupings

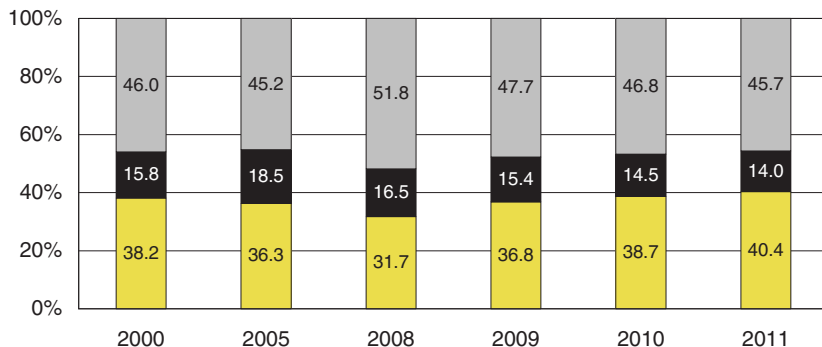

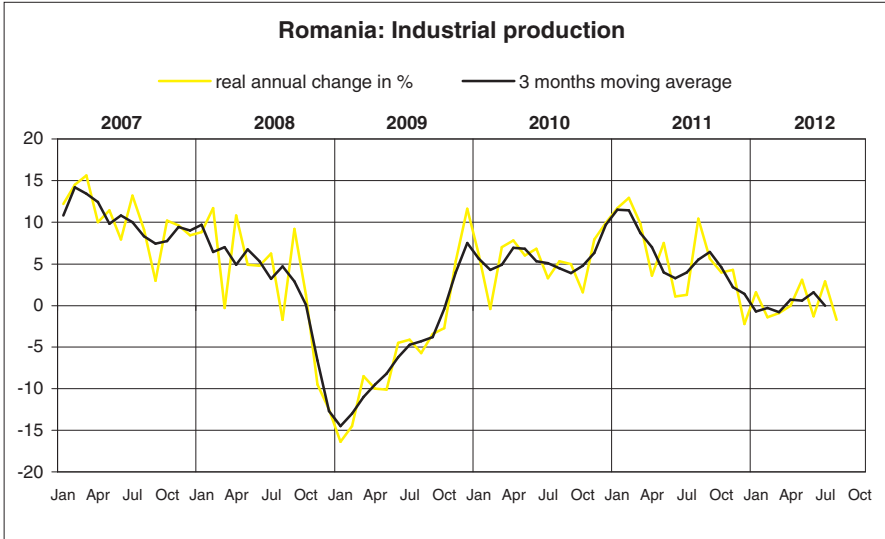

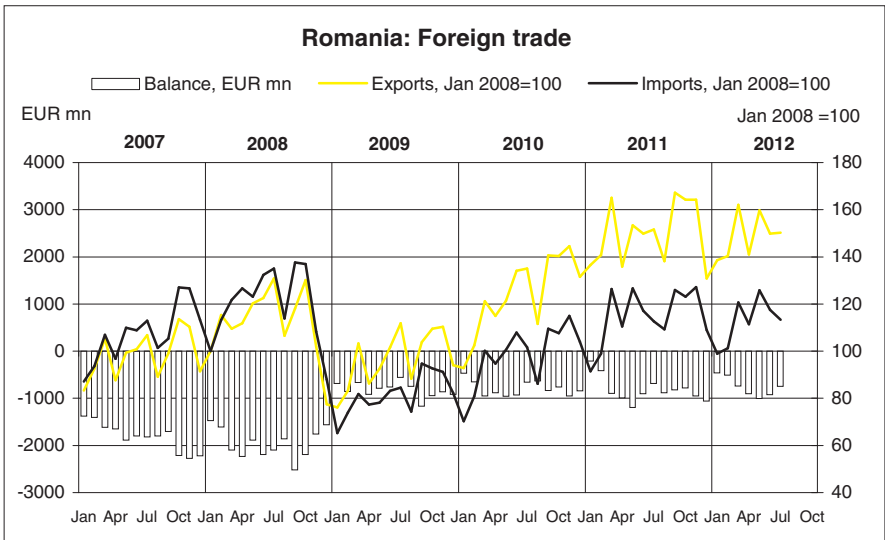

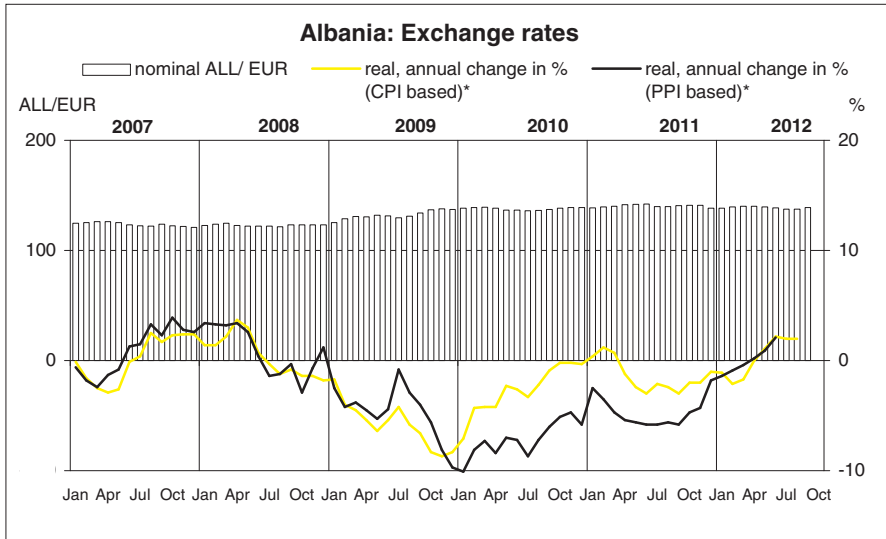

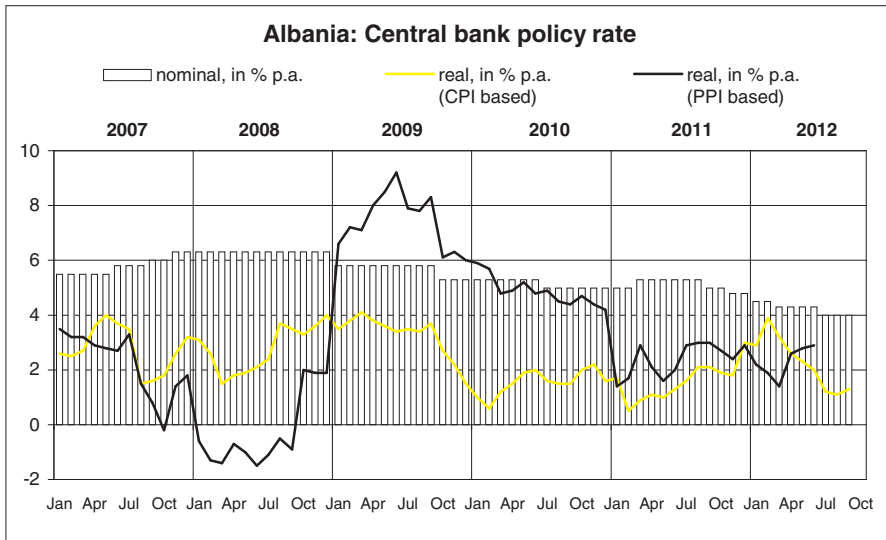
